Drop in anytime between 18:00–20:00 to collect and redeem your 2 x drinks vouchers. Vouchers can be exchanged at the bar for wine, beer, soft or spirit + mixer.

Stay for as long as you like as the Shakespeare is open all day and into the evening. They do serve food if you do wish to order. There are also many other eateries in close proximity.

Located a 12–15 minute walk from the Bristol Hotel, the SS Great Britain is a museum ship and former passenger steamship that was advanced for her time. The largest passenger ship in the world from 1845 to 1853, she was designed by Isambard Kingdom Brunel (1806–1859), for the Great Western Steamship Company's transatlantic service between Bristol and New York City.

There will also be a pay bar available in the Hayward for those that require alternative drinks to those included.

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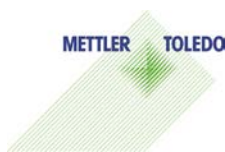
